In September 2020, Shelter Scotland launched its Social Housing Campaign, calling on the Scottish Government to commit to building a minimum of 37,100 homes for social rent over the next 5 years (2021 – 2026). This is the number of homes required to begin to reduce housing need in Scotland, transform the lives of thousands of people and support Scotland's economic recovery.


